BCA Annual Meeting Tuesday Sept. 16, 2003 at 7 PM Anderson High School Theatre

Speaker: Patricia Wadsack, P.E. City of Austin Public Works Dept.

Topic: Mesa & Greystone Transmission Mains Project - Effects of Construction on Our Area

In early 2004, the City of Austin Public Works Dept. will begin a project on Mesa Dr. and Greystone Dr. to install additional water transmission lines in the area between Spicewood Springs Rd. and Far West Blvd. The long-range goal is to improve water capacity to homes in this area. Work on Greystone Dr. will occur between Valburn and Park View, and between Mesa and West Rim. Work on Mesa Dr. will take place from Spicewood Springs Rd. to Far West Blvd. The existing 20-inch water transmission line on the east side of Mesa Dr. will be cleaned after the new transmission line is installed.

Construction on this project is expected to take about 12 months. During the time that this improvement project is underway, two-way traffic will be maintained on Mesa Dr. (one lane only each direction) between Spicewood Springs Rd. and Greystone Dr. Two-way traffic (one lane each direction) will also be maintained along Greystone Dr. However, traffic on Mesa Dr. between Greystone and Far West Blvd. will be one-way only, northbound. Southbound traffic on Mesa from Greystone Dr. to Far West Blvd. will be rerouted to Waterline or Chimney Corners. Trench-less technology (boring and jacking) will be used to install the new water line along Mesa Dr. through the intersection with Spicewood Springs Rd. so that two-way traffic can continue using the intersection during construction.

Ms. Patricia Wadsack is Project Manager for this water transmission improvement project. Come to the BCA annual meeting on Sept. 16 to hear details and ask questions about this up-coming water utility project.

22 Amendments Proposed for Texas Constitution in Sept. 13 Election

YOU CAN PROTECT YOUR NEIGHBORHOOD

There are many City codes and regulations in existence in Austin which are designed to support a peaceful, compatible, neighborhood environment. Various neighborhood problems can be addressed with specific City departments, as shown by the list below. This list is not comprehensive, but is a guide to help in finding support for initiating action to alleviate a disturbing or non-conforming condition on your street.

During your quest for information and action, you may be confronted with having to contact several different departments or city agencies to find the appropriate person to answer your questions. Agencies want to help, but they have organizational responsibilities which sometimes compromise their ability to assist in a specific situation. You may be transferred several times to different people in different departments. There is no "one-stop resource" in the City of Austin. The main thing to remember is to write down names and phone numbers of the people to whom you have been referred, so that you can follow up later about the specific problem.

What follows are some situations or problems which can be pursued with various City departments. Note that phone numbers for many of the appropriate departments are listed in our BCA newsletter on p.2. Also, in the government "blue pages" section of our yellow pages telephone directories, under the "City Government" main heading, is a section entitled "Complaints," which contains many useful telephone numbers.

Put Your Plumbing on a 'Fat-Free' Diet

Many of Austin's sewage overflows are caused by grease blockage. The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has ordered Austin to eliminate sewage overflows caused by grease and aging sewer lines by Dec. 2007, or face serious fines. The Austin Clean Water Program (ACWP) has begun an extensive initiative to repair or replace old sewer lines to meet the EPA deadline.

You can help protect homes, yards, etc., from sewage overflows by keeping sewers fat free:

- Never pour grease down sink drains or into toilets. Grease comes from meats, butter, margarine, food scraps, sauces and dairy products.
- Place grease in the garbage in a plastic bag or other sealed container (to prevent bugs).
- * Use a strainer in sink drains to prevent food scraps from going into the garbage disposal.
