

Sex Offenders in Our Area

One of our residents with young children has brought to our attention that several registered sex offenders live in or near our neighborhood. To help keep our area children safe, we want residents to have the information necessary to view the names and addresses of registered sex offenders living in our area. We found that the easiest way to find this information is by going to the Texas Dept. of Public Safety records database on their website. The State website hyperlink is:

https://records.txdps.state.tx.us/sosearch/default.cfm

- 1. Log on to the state website hyperlink. At the bottom of the first screen will be a statement: "I have read the Web Site Caveats and agree to the terms." You <u>must click</u> on the "Agree" box in order to be able to go any farther.
- 2. After clicking on the "Agree to terms" box, a new screen will appear asking for the sex offender's name, address, etc. Just enter your local zip code in the appropriate box and click "begin search."
- 3. A list of registered sex offenders in that zip code will appear. Under each sex offender's name is the last known address. Beside each sex offender's name is an icon on which you can click to view that person's record.

Site Development Regulations - Austin

Several people have asked about finding information on city restrictions for erecting homes and other buildings on residential lots (e.g., shed behind home). Listed below are instructions for finding this information. These are also on our BCA website.

Details are listed below on how to find the Site Development Regulations table in paragraph 25-2-492 of the City of Austin Code of Ordinances. The section of the City Code which contains the Site Development Regulations table is: **Volume II, Title 25. Land Development**

Chapter 25-2. Zoning

Subchapter C. Use and Development Regulations Article 2. Principal Use and Development Regulations Div. 1. Regulations Tables

- 1. Log on to the Am. Legal Publishing Corp. web link at www.amlegal.com/austin_tx (There is an underline between austin and tx.) Choose the "no frames" option on the main screen.
- 2. In the search box on the upper left side of the next screen, type in a number for a particular section of the Land Development Code (e.g., type in <u>25-2</u>).
- 3. On the next screen, click on "Title 25. Land Development." A list of chapters will appear on the screen. Click on <u>25-2</u>. Zoning.
- 4. A list of subchapters and articles for Chapter 25-2 will soon appear, with Subchapter A at the top of the list. Scroll down this list until you get to "Subchapter C. Use and Development Regulations."
- 5. Under Subchapter C, keep scrolling down until you get to Article 2. Div. 1. "Regulation Tables." Click on <u>25-2-492</u>. "Site Development Regulations"
- 6. The site development regulations table will soon appear. Look under the appropriate zoning classification (e.g., "SF-3) to find the minimum requirements for the property of interest. Definitions of the various zoning 'districts' or classifications, are given in Subchapter A.
- 7. Printing the table is a bit more tricky. Follow these steps to print a useful copy of the table.
 - a. Click on File, then click on Page Setup. Select "landscape" rather than "portrait."
 - b. Click on <u>File</u>, then click <u>Print Preview</u>. Scroll through the first 110 pages one by one until you find the pages containing the Site Development Regulations Table. (There are 369 pages total in Chapter 25-2 in 'landscape' format.)
 - c. Click on Print and enter pages 108-111 in the page range box. Click OK.
