FOCUS ON CRIME PREVENTION

Editor's Note:

We are fortunate to live in an area that is generally peaceful, where the incidence of crime is relatively low, especially for violent crime, which includes murder, rape, robbery and aggravated assault. However, we cannot afford to lower our guard, especially as many property crimes are committed in our geographical area each year, including burglary, theft, and auto theft.

As we move into summer, we move into a time when many of us will be going on vacation. Children will be out of school, and running in and out of the house to play. Some of you will be moving, and will open your homes for showings and open houses. It is during this season that we especially need to be cautious about putting ours homes and ourselves at risk for crime.

Here is a VACATION CHECKLIST, courtesy of the Austin Police Department:

- 1. Lock all doors, including the garage door. (Check your exterior door to make sure the hinges are on the inside, rather than on the outside of the door.)
- 2. Lock all windows, including basement and garage windows.
- 3. Cancel all deliveries such as mail, newspapers, food services, etc. (or arrange for a neighbor pick up all of your mail and newspapers while you are gone).
- 4. Arrange for someone to pick up all of the handbills, doorhangers and throw-aways while you are gone.
- 5. Never leave a note on the door that would indicate your absence.
- 6. Arrange to have the lawn cut while you are gone.
- 7. Let a neighbor know where you can be reached in the event of an emergency.
- 8. Place a light or two on automatic timers.
- 9. Remover ladders from sight and secure them in a safe place.
- 10. Never "hide" keys under doormats or flowerpots (or similar places).
- 11. Secure items such as jewelry, furs, cameras, credit cards and checkbooks
- 12. Arrange for a house-sitter, if possible, or for a neighbor to keep an eye on your property and report anything suspicious to police.
- 13. Adjust blinds to make your home appear occupied.
- 14. Ask a neighbor to leave his or her car parked in your driveway, or in front of your home.
- 15. Leave a radio on just inside your doorway. Lower the ringer tone on your telephone.

IDENTITY THEFT PREVENTION (Guarding Your Social Security Number)

Identity theft has become increasingly (and alarmingly!) common. With the help and input of First State Bank, we offer these suggestions for protecting your social security number:

Question: When should I give out my Social Security number?

Answer: Your employer and financial institutions need your Social Security Number (SSN) for wage and tax reporting purposes. Other businesses may ask you for your SSN to do a credit check if you are applying for a loan or signing up for utilities. Sometimes, businesses simply want it for general record keeping. If someone asks for your SSN, ask:

1. Why do you need my SSN?

- 4. What will happen if I don't give you my SSN?

If you don't provide your SSN, some businesses may not provide you with the service or benefit you want. Getting satisfactory answers to these questions will help you decide whether you want to share your Social Security number with the business. The decision to share is yours.

Most thefts have occurred at homes under construction; some have occurred at residences. (Thieves are after copper wiring, which has gone through the roof in pricing.) If you see anything suspicious, please call 911.

Stolen Rims/Tires: Another hot item is wheel tires and rims, mostly from Honda and Acura's. Officer Dunn advises residents to keep their cars in their garage.

Speaking of the garage, you can protect yourself from theft largely by keeping your garage door closed. Officer Dunn says that leaving the garage door open is the main cause of theft in our neighborhood.
