Hello neighbors,

A crime watch meeting was held for our neighborhood August 10, 4pm at the home of Connie Jones, CHNNA Secretary. This meeting was advertised several times with emails and on the kiosk. For those of you unable to attend thank you to Connie for hosting and Deputy Jones and Detective Ramsey for informing us on county code violations.

Attending were neighbors and board members interesting in learning how we can protect our property from crime and encouraging others to do the same.

Many of you know about calling 311 for non- emergencies, calling 911 for criminal activity including trespassing or other emergencies. There were many 311 code violation calls that are being made in our neighborhood regarding vehicles, trash, and nuisance properties or neighbors.

Examples of 311 non-emergencies

- Abandoned cars (inoperable, tags and registration expired, trailers parked on the street or on the grass) Vehicles are considered abandoned after 48 hours. (applies to vehicles 5 years or older)
- Vehicles marked by TCSO will be removed within 48 hours
- Vehicles parked with right wheel to curb/Passenger-side to on-coming traffic
- Grass/weeds taller than 36 inches (Public Health)
- Trash in or around the property (Public Health) (trash needs to be stored and/or put in a receptacle) Know your trash pickup days (call your waste pickup service about bulk items)

Safety Tips

- Leave a TV/Radio on, even if leaving for short period of time
- Leave your front/rear porch light on at night

Please do your best to stay informed, get involved, and attend our upcoming neighborhood quarterly meeting August 20 and National Night Out, October 7.
