Every wonder how much to talk about adoption, if your child will wonder about their birth family, or how they feel about you and being adopted? Being open with your child, letting them be the guide to those questions and answers as well as dwelling on the future, not the past, have been my life lessons. Born in 1970, Michael Davolt was adopted into his family as a baby. He was raised by his mother with an older sister, who was also adopted at birth, and a younger brother that was born from his adoptive parents just a year after he joined the family. Well, adoptions from China have changed dramatically and led to the adoption of their son Ty from Ethiopia in November of 2009. Today they live happily in Round Rock, TX and following in the footsteps of Michael's family, are expecting a child in June 2011, but still hold hopes of adopting from China... well some day.
