
HANCOCK NEIGHBORHOOD ASSOCIATION NEWSLETTER

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
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
OFFICER ELECTIONS

OCTOBER 29 MEETING NOTES

- 1. Peck trail section discussed with Austin Parks Department. Parks will have trail built by a Public Works contractor and Parks will correct any deficiencies in the contractor's work.
- 2. Reclaimed water line-This line will be installed under Red River starting around June 2009. They will stage at the Hancock Recreation Area. Mitigation needs to be worked out, but Parks is leaning towards Public Works paying for leasing parkland by providing the golf course a certain amount of free irrigation.

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

HOLIDAY SECURITY PRECAUTIONS

Austin police have warned that a bad economy could mean earlier and more theft and burglary during the holidays.

Please be advised that a locked gate can reduce your vulnerability to burglars. Many break-ins take place through the back door and when no car is in the driveway.

Porch lights, a light kept on inside during the night or when you are away, a noisy dog, locked doors – all are deterrents to potential thieves. Don't overlook the simple ways to keep your home secure. Most burglars are looking for easy targets.

Investigate security audits available from home security companies. One such local company is Allsafe Security at 990-9000, recommended by a Hancock Neighborhood Association member

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SHORT TERM HEALTH INSURANCE

Short term health insurance is an option for people who are between jobs and depend on their employer for health coverage. It can be written for as little as 30 days and as long as 18 months.

In some cases, if there are no pre-existing conditions, short term health insurance is less expensive than the cost of COBRA, which a prior employer will provide at an increased cost after you have left a position. Depending on your circumstances, if you plan on not securing another position in 18 months that will provide medical insurance, an individual policy could be more suitable. Before making a decision, contact your insurance agent for the policy that best suits your needs.

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PICK UP FOR BIG BLUE RECYCLING

According to the City (311), if your trash is picked up in the alley – then your recycling will also be picked up in the alley. Just be sure the trash bin is at least 5 feet away from the recycling bin to allow adequate space for pickup equipment.

LABYRINTH AS METAPHOR

A labyrinth is an ancient symbol that combines the imagery of the circle and the spiral into a meandering but purposeful path. The Labyrinth represents a journey to our own center and back again out into the world. Labyrinths have long been used as meditation and prayer tools. It is a symbol that creates a sacred space and place and takes us out of our ego to "That Which Is Within."

A labyrinth has only one path. It is unicursal. The way in is the way out. There are no blind alleys. The path leads you on a circuitous path to the center and out again.

At its most basic level the labyrinth is a metaphor for the journey to the center of your deepest self and back out into the world with a broadened understanding of who you are.

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
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BUDDHIST TEMPLE ON 45TH

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
