### A LETTER FROM YOUR ASSOCIATION BOARD

Dear Northwood Neighbors,

As we begin the New Year, we must give thanks for the many volunteers who help make Northwood a special place to live. First and foremost, thanks to Donna Blumberg for cranking out the newsletter, and to Scott Carruth for maintaining our web site. Thanks also to those who deliver the newsletters and work on activities such as the Easter Egg Hunt, July 4<sup>th</sup> Parade, and Yard of the Month. The contributions of our volunteers make a huge difference!

These days, we cannot even get out of the neighborhood without seeing change. Construction is beginning on the office building at Oak Creek and Loop 1, and the tract of land on Oak Creek next to the storage unit facility is for sale. This site was zoned for a commercial building in 1991, with some limitations. And the tract next to the office building (zoned SF-6, multifamily residential) is currently under contract. The City has adopted a master plan for the North Burnet/Gateway area near the Domain shopping center that will allow redevelopment into a fully-functional area with a mix of residential, commercial, and retail structures. All of this activity can be a bit unsettling, so we must continue to be vigilant and do all we can to ensure an overall beneficial effect on our neighborhood.

Ongoing projects we are working on include planning for beautification and pedestrian improvements at our "entrance" at Silver Creek and Parmer, and revival of the neighborhood Bar-B-Q (thanks again to volunteers).

Some of these projects will likely require an expenditure of funds to come to fruition. For example, to create and install a metal sign on the concrete wall on Silver Creek at Parmer is estimated to cost \$3,000 or more. This project has been discussed at our last two meetings, but we ask for your input regarding the merits since this would be a significant expenditure of funds.

We also ask that you support these efforts by paying your dues! Without residents paying dues, we are not able to complete some of these projects, and may not be able to continue publishing the newsletter in its current form and bi-monthly frequency.

Please feel free to email or call us with your comments or concerns. We look forward to serving you in the coming year.

### Watch for Oak Wilt

As spring approaches and the trees begin to bud, be sure to watch your oak trees for signs of illness. If the leaves don't develop normally, you may have oak wilt. If you suspect oak wilt, contact one of the officers. We can have a professional evaluate the tree and recommend the appropriate treatment. And for members who are current on their dues, the Association will help pay for the treatment.

### **Bugs Around Your Potted Plants?**

Even though temperatures are chilly outside, are you having bug problems indoors? Have

you seen little, black gnats flying around your home? If these gnats are found around house plants, you could have a fungus gnat problem.

Fungus gnats are dark brownish-black with long, slender legs and antennae. The wings are clear to smoky with few distinct veins. Larvae are maggot-like, creamy in color and found in the soil of potted plants. Larvae feed on decaying organic matter and sometimes roots of plants.

No real treatment is required for fungus gnats, as they are more of a nuisance than a

problem, but to get rid of them, the source must be located and managed. Larvae prefer very moist environments, so allow soil to completely dry out between waterings. Larvae can be killed by using insecticide soil drenches and adults can often be captured utilizing fly strips, traps or lights.

# Participate in your party's precinct convention!

WHAT: Elect delegates to go to the county convention. Those delegates can be elected to go on to the state and even national convention. Also, proposed resolutions for the party's platform are discussed and voted upon.

WHO: Anyone who voted in a party primary is eligible to participate in that party's convention whether he or she voted on election day or in early voting. You may only participate in your home precinct. WHERE: The convention will be at your election day polling place. Look for a sign to direct you to your party's meeting place. WHEN: The convention will start after the polls close on March 4<sup>th</sup>, usually at 7:15. WHY: The precinct convention is where democracy happens and it is a great way to meet neighbors.

### A Dryer Disclaimer

Be sure to check your lint trap in your dryer periodically. Besides cleaning the lint off it, hold it under running water. Does the water run through the screen or stay on top of it? If the latter, then the screen is also blocking heat from escaping through it. (The dryer sheets are one cause of this situation.)

At best that invisible blockage makes the dryer use a bit more energy to work. At worst, it could cause a fire. Clean the lint trap with an old toothbrush or other brush.
