

Stage 2 Watering in Place

From cityofaustin.org/watercon/stage2.htm As of August 24, 2009 stage 2 watering



restrictions are in place. That means that residences with oddnumbered addresses can water their yards on Saturday; those

with even-numbered addresses can water on Sunday. Automatic systems may water before 10 a.m.; Hose-end Sprinklers, Soaker Hoses may water before 10 a.m. and/or after 7 p.m. Hand-held watering may be done any day, any time.

Violations are Class C misdemeanors, with each instance punishable by a fine of up to \$500. To report violations call 311. &

Recycling Review

The new single stream recycling program has been in place for a while now, and not everyone is familiar with its details. Austin has a "zero land fill" goal (see next article), so it is important to recycle as much as possible.

First, leave about 6 feet of space between the recycling and trash cans when they are at the

curb for pickup so the automated trucks can easily grab the correct container.

If you have too much recycling material to fit in the 90-gallon blue container, place it in a cardboard box and the crew will take the box and contents. Do NOT place the previouslyused blue plastic recycling container at the curb unless you want it to be recycled (they won't be emptied, just picked up).

What can be recycled curbside in the cart? **Paper:** newspaper, office paper, junk mail, envelopes, wrapping paper

- **Boxboard and cardboard:** corrugated cardboard and boxboard. Examples of boxboard: cereal boxes, shoe boxes, most gift boxes, soda/beverage containers, most food packaging containers such as boxes of macaroni and cheese, rice, microwave meals.
- Aluminum and metal cans: rinsed food cans (labels left on OK), soda cans Glass: Jars and bottles (rinsed)
- **Rigid plastics:** # 1 through # 7, including yogurt and margarine tubs (again, rinsed)

What cannot be recycled in your cart? Please DON'T place the following in your Single Stream Recycling cart:

- Plastic bags
- Styrofoam® (cups, egg cartons, take-out containers)
 - Pizza boxes (with food stains)
 - Yard waste/leaves (set out for yard trimmings pick up)
 - Food waste (consider composting)
 - Garbage
 - Helium tanks

• Large metal items (steel cans,

aerosol cans or metals that are gallonsized or smaller are ok. Frying pans and large metal pipes are not ok)



- Large plastic items (rigid plastics that are gallon-sized or smaller are ok)
- Wire coat hangers (recycle at your local dry cleaners)

Austin has "zero waste" goal

From cityofaustin.org/sws/0waste.htm Central Texas continues to grow, which means more land is needed to build homes, businesses, etc. That means that less land is available for landfills for garbage. With this in mind, in 2005 Austin set a goal of achieving a 20% reduction in per capita solid waste disposal to landfills and incinerators by 2012, and a 90% reduction ("zero waste") in waste sent to landfills and incinerators by 2040. This will be accomplished by using a "whole system" approach to evaluate and manage the flow of resources and waste created by our communities.

We can all do our part to reach this 2012 goal – in under 3 years - by recycling as much as possible and reducing the amount of non-recycled materials that we use. &

Reduce waste and improve your yard—mulch, grasscycle, compost! From cityofaustin.org/sws/compost.htm Other ways of recycling are to

- Mulch (spread grass and yard clippings around plants a few inches from the stem)
- Grasscycle (leave grass clippings on the lawn to decompose into soil. This

provides 60% of the nitrogen and all the phosphorous that your lawn needs.

• Compost – bins are recommended to discourage pests; many are available online or you can build your own.

Easy compost recipe

- 1. Put different yard trimmings such as leaves and grass clippings in a bin or pile. You should have a mix of green material and brown material. Add water so the pile is slightly damp. "Turn" the pile at least once a month. The pile should reach a temperature of 130 to 160 degrees and will be ready in 6 to 9 months. The more frequently you turn the pile, the faster your compost will be ready.
- 2. Add fruit and vegetable scraps, coffee grounds, tea leaves and eggshells as generated (avoid bread, grease, oils, meat and dairy products, pet feces, ashes and charcoal). Cover the new kitchen scraps with leaves or bury them in the pile. If the pile dries out, add more water to keep it damp.
- 3. After 12 to 16 months, most of the material at the bottom of the pile will be dark, rich sweet-smelling compost. Sift or sort out any large, undecomposed materials.
- 4. Sprinkle on your yard and garden!
